Jude Stephans, Team Support Coordinator, Refugee Program, Catholic Charities of the East Bay Jude Stephens is the Team Support Coordinator for Catholic Charities of the East Bay's Family-to-Family/POWR (People Organized to Welcome Refugees) Program. She began in 2011 working in the Family to Family Program, which brings volunteer groups to mentor families striving to transition out of poverty. In January 2016, the POWR Initiative was launched to provide a continuum of care and mentoring to the refugee families arriving through the agency's Refugee Resettlement Department, following the model of Family-to-Family. The groups are formed within a faith community, assisted with organization and training, then introduced to an incoming refugee family or a struggling family within their own community.
